With the City of Calgary's Mosquito Aircraft now on display at our museum, we will be focusing on the Canadian aircrew who

lost their lives during World War II while flying in this iconic aircraft. 56 airmen lost their lives flying Mosquitoes in Canada

and almost 300 overseas.

The names of the Canadians who were killed while flying in Mosquito Bombers with Bomber Command will be highlighted on

Canada's Bomber Command Memorial Wall.

During Nanton's Remembrance Day Services at 11:00, Bob O'Connor, a wartime Mosquito navigator with 627 Squadron of the Pathfinders, will lay a wreath in their memory.

At 1:30 pm we will be showing our recently released documentary, "The Belgian Forest," that tells the story of the Canadian

Halifax Bomber that crashed in 1944 and how the aluminum from the aircraft became part of the Bomber Command Memorial in London.
