

The Nuremberg Raid

It was the worst night of the war for Bomber Command. During the night of March 30/31 1944, Bomber Command suffered greater losses than Fighter Command did during the entire Battle of Britain. 108 out of 782 bombers were lost and the target suffered only light damage. The aim of the Nuremberg raid was not unlike many hundreds of other operations but due to the enemy defences, weather, and bad luck, it went horribly wrong. 109 Canadians were amongst the 545 Bomber Command airmen killed that night.

Martin Middlebrook

Martin Middlebrook is a British military historian and Fellow of the Royal Historical Society. His first book The First Day on the Somme chronicles the single worst day for the British Army.

Middlebrook's Second World War books concentrate on the air war. A number of them deal with a single day of action (The Nuremberg Raid, The Schweinfurt-Regensburg Mission and The Peenemünde Raid) while others cover longer battles (The Battle of Hamburg and The Berlin Raids). His Bomber Command War Diaries is an indispensible reference to museums such as the Bomber Command Museum of Canada. Middlebrook has also written two books on the Falklands War.
