CLIFF BLACK DFC

We are saddened to advise of the passing of our museum's good friend and supporter, Cliff Black DFC. A native of Nova Scotia, Cliff enlisted in the RCAF in June 1940. He served in Canada on both the Pacific and Atlantic coasts prior to being posted overseas to 419 Squadron in April 1944. From January 1945 until the end of the war, Cliff served as the Commanding Officer of 426 Squadron based at Linton-on-Ouse. He continued his RCAF career after the war, serving for a total of thirty years.


